is the Primary Goal of Systems of Support at Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3




Strategic development of your school's MTSS helps create the optimal conditions for:


- 1. Well-Managed Stress
- 2. Executive Skills Development




MTSS Requires a Commitment to:

- Embedding a strategic decisionmaking model into school culture
- Building a Multi-Tiered Continuum of Support









MTSS Big Idea:

Strategic Prevention:

Systems and practices to effectively prevent socialemotional-behavioral and academic concerns.

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
<u>Tier 1 Prevention:</u> Teach Expected Social Behaviors


- 1. Provide engaging instruction
- 2. Practice behaviors in context
- 3. Provide effective feedback:
 - Notice desired behavior
 - Correct by demonstrating the desired behavior
- 4. Assess fidelity of implementation
- 5. Assess effectiveness of strategy



Basic Tier 1 MTSS Behavioral Ethics

- We should never be in the position of thinking that a student may have behaved incorrectly because he/she wasn't effectively taught the expected behavior.
- "Taught" implies "Learned".

Tier 1 Strategic Response:


Systems and practices to effectively respond to social-emotional-behavioral concerns.


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Tier 1 Response System Features

- 1. Clear Behavioral Definitions
- 2. Consistent Process for Responding to Behavior Concerns
- 3. Efficient Office Referral Data Form
- 4. Commitment to accurate data gathering
- 5. Commitment to regular data review and using data for decision making







Digging Deeper

- Schools that dig deeper into Tier 1 go beyond behavioral teaching and establish school-wide culture through:
 - Common structures/routines/practices and
 - Common strategies/curricula that support the development of executive skills.



When You Commit to a Practice; Implement it!

- It will vary school to school what you decide to implement school-wide, but a key MTSS principle is:
 - When you decide to implement a school-wide strategy, routine, theme, curriculum ... do so with fidelity!
 - And then assess it's impact.



As Tier 1 Evolves, Consider School-wide Practices for:

- <u>A Problem-solving using a common methodology</u> (STAR: Stop, Think, Act, Review; Collaborative Problem-Solving; Peace Path;...)
- <u>A school-wide curriculum or strategy that teaches</u>
 <u>emotional regulation</u> (Zones of Regulation; "The
 Incredible 5-Point Scale"; "How Does Your Engine Run"...)
- A SW curriculum/strategy/protocol that teaches stress awareness/management (something that promotes proactive stress awareness and the gradual building of stress management strategies). (Mindfulness; Stress Meter; Challenge to Manage; Zones;...).
- <u>A cognitive-behavioral strategy/curriculum for</u>
 <u>Impulse Control; Listening/Attending; and/or</u>
 <u>Social Thinking...</u> (Whole-body listening; SLANT; Social Thinking/ SuperFlex; Hunter's Amazing Remote Control;...)
