1. An agency uses the power of the arts to work toward creating a society where people with and without disabilities have the same opportunities to experience the arts as artists and as audience members. **(VSA)**

2. An Agency that is the only state-wide organization in New Hampshire dedicated to brain injury and stroke support, prevention, education, and advocacy for survivors and caregivers. **(Brain Injury Association)**

3. An organization of activists has provided support to families of people living with special needs in NH's Upper Valley since 1979. **(Special Needs Support Center)**

4. A statewide family organization that strives to achieve positive outcomes for children and youth, with a focus on those with disabilities and special healthcare needs through partnerships with families, educators, youth, professionals and organizations. **(PIC - The Parent Information Center)**

5. A parent-driven agency dedicated to supporting families with children who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing without a bias around communication modes or methodology. **(Hand & Voices)**

6. An Agency that works with the community to meet the mental health needs of its residents by providing evaluation, treatment, resource development, and education. **(Community Mental Health Centers)**

7. This Faith Based agency works to break the cycle of poverty, and build thriving communities where everyone has the chance to achieve their full potential, regardless of background or disadvantage. Formerly Lutheran Family Services **(Acentria)**

8. This program promotes the school readiness of young children from low-income families through agencies in their local community. They support the mental,

social, and emotional development of children from birth to age 5. In addition to education services, programs provide children and their families with health, nutrition, social, and other services that are responsive to each child and family's ethnic, cultural, and linguistic heritage. **(Head Start)**

9. The Organization works to ensure the political, educational, social, and economic equality of rights of all persons and to eliminate race-based discrimination. **(NAACP)**

10. The Agency is a private, nonprofit that works to advance the well-being of children and families through an array of social services including child abuse prevention, intervention and treatment; mental health counseling; home-based family strengthening and support; runaway and homeless youth services; eldercare; transitional and independent living; foster care; family counseling; adolescent substance abuse treatment; in-school social work; early intervention for children with developmental concerns; after-school programs for adjudicated youth; pregnancy counseling and prenatal supports & services; support for families with children who have chronic health conditions; adoption; summer camp for disadvantaged youth; and a child advocacy program that works at the legislative level to protect the best interests of children. **(Child and Family Services)**

11. This organization offers a variety of affordable programs—including associate degrees, certificates, community and corporate education, employment-ready programs, and online courses. They offer a rolling open-admission policy to anyone with a high school diploma or GED. **(Community Colleges)**

12. An Organization that heightens the awareness of the Hispanic culture, provides networking opportunities to share information of common interest around Hispanic reality and the community. **(Hispanic Network)**

13. A Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children that is a federally funded program through the (USDA) for healthcare and nutrition of

low-income pregnant women, breastfeeding women, and infants and children under five. **(WIC)**

14. This agency empowers individuals with developmental disabilities by providing support and services that maximize independence including inclusive employment opportunities with the community. **(Plus Company)**

15. An area or region containing the schools that a school board is in charge of; aka Leas **(School Districts)**

16. This is a division of a local or larger government responsible for the oversight and care of matters relating to public health. **(City Health Departments)**

17. A medical practitioner specializing in children and their health care needs. **(Pediatrician)**

18. Family-School Partnership groups offering networking opportunities, education and support to parents of children with special needs. **(Parent/School Networks or Support Groups)**

19. An ethnic community-based organization whose mission is to aid in the resettlement of refugee and immigrant groups by providing assistance, training, resources, and opportunities that promotes self-sufficiency. **(ORIS – Organization for Refugee & Immigration Success)**

20. This state-wide organization is dedicated to putting the needs of New Hampshire's child abuse victims first. **(Granite State Children's Alliance)**

21. This agency manages protective programs on behalf of New Hampshire's children and youth and their families. Their staff provide a wide range of family-

centered services with the goal of meeting the needs of parents and their children and strengthening the family system. **(DCYF)**

22. This organization has been called the “heart” of Derry. Nearly 150 non-profit groups and organizations from Southern NH meet at the Center throughout the year. They primarily provide their facilities free of charge, although they request donations. **(Marion Gerrish Community Center)**

23. This organization is a non-profit Family Resource Center, committed to the development of strong individuals and families in the community. They have a team of dedicated professionals who are actively working to improve the family life of the citizens of Derry and surrounding communities. **(Upper Room)**

24. A group of individuals united on the basis of religious or spiritual beliefs. **(Faith Based Organizations)**

25. This Organization is a community-based programs designed to address the needs of families of children with chronic health conditions **(Partners in Health)**

26. This program provides life-skills education to limited income individuals, seniors, groups and youth to teach the basics of nutrition, food safety, shopping wisely for food, menu planning, physical activity and reading food labels. **(Youth & Family Connections)**

27. This agency provides free, confidential services to families and professionals caring for children with chronic conditions and / or disabilities. We empower and inform families and professionals to feel confident when making choices for children and youth in their care. **(NH Family Voices)**

28. This organization provides innovative mental health care to adolescents and their families through an Intensive Outpatient or Partial Hospitalization Programs to provide an alternative to traditional hospitalization. **(Directions Behavioral Health)**

29. These agencies are accessible throughout the state. They are private non-profit organizations that maintain programs and services which promote growth and independence for individuals with developmental disabilities. **(Area Agencies)**

30. This is an organization whose mission it is to eliminate child abuse and neglect in the Granite State. They invest in evidence-based prevention strategies focusing on the most vulnerable population - children under three-years-old and their families. They offer trainings, workshops and conferences (including the Strengthening Families Summit) around creating safe, stable and nurturing families and communities, and eliminating child abuse and neglect. **(NH Children's Trust)**

31. This organization provides grants to school districts and private not-for-profit organizations for the purposes of offering educational services to adults who have not received a high school diploma or high school equivalency certificate, or who need to improve basic skills in reading, math, writing, and English language learning. **(Bureau of Adult Education)**

32. This National Agency provides exceptional services, education, outreach, and advocacy so that people living with autism and other disabilities can live, learn, work and play in our communities. They have been helping individuals with disabilities and special needs, and their families, live better lives for more than 90 years. From child development centers to physical rehabilitation and job training for people with disabilities, they offer a variety of services to help people with disabilities address life's challenges and achieve personal goals. **(Easter Seals)**

33. This is a day school with services in Rochester and Gonic that serves children ages 5 – 21, with significant physical, medical, developmental, behavioral and emotional disabilities. We are founded on the principles of ABA (Applied Behavior Analysis) which are applied in the classrooms and across all supports, treatments and therapies. **(Monarch School)**

34. This school in Newington operates the first and only special educational day program approved by the New Hampshire Department of Education that enrolls exclusively children and youth with autism. **(Birchtree School)**

- 35.** This is a private school in Merrimack that is designed to meet the needs of students with learning and emotional challenges. **(Brentwood School)**
- 36.** This is a school is approved by the State of New Hampshire, as a special education school, that services students from New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Maine, Vermont, New York, New Jersey and other states. **(Crotched Mountain)**
- 37.** This Organization serves girls and boys between the ages of 5 and 18, providing them with the opportunities and services that they need to succeed in life. They provide diverse programs that attract and retain children with a variety of interests and needs. They offer a variety of team sports, clubs and activities as well as before and after school care. **(Boys & Girls Club)**
- 38.** This Organization is an educational institution designed for instruction, examination, or both, of students in many branches of advanced learning. **(Universities)**
- 39.** This is the largest agency in New Hampshire state government, responsible for the health, safety and well-being of the citizens of New Hampshire. DHHS provides services for individuals, children, families and seniors and administers programs and services such as mental health, developmental disability, substance abuse and public health. **(DHHS / department of Health & Human Services)**
- 40.** This agency provides educational leadership and services which promote equal educational opportunities and quality practices and programs that enable New Hampshire residents to become fully productive members of society." **(DOE / Department of Education)**
- 41.** This Organization works closely with volunteer leadership to invest donor dollars in the areas of the community with the most critical needs - **Education, Income and Health**. By focusing on these investment initiatives, we are helping people in a new and strategic ways. **(United Way)**
