

Volunteers Complete Clean-Up of NH Accessible Trails April 2022

The New Hampshire Disability and Health Program partnered with the University of New Hampshire Recreation Management and Policy department to conduct an accessible trails clean-up day at Croton Mountain in Greenfield, NH. On April 23, 2022, 12 student volunteers widened the trails, removed obstacles from the paths, and cleared the base camp of debris under the guidance of Croton Mountain Foundation staff. The project made sure people of all ability levels, including wheelchair users, would be able to safely use the trails this hiking season. As of April 25th, the trails are open for the season.
