What Is Our Topic?

Adult Dental Medicaid Benefit

- Governor Sununu signed
 HB 103 and SB 422 into law on
 July 1, 2022
- Went into effect on April 1, 2023
- Our task was to do something about it

Forming

We met early on:

Storming

Identified who might wear which of the 6 hats

Neutral and objective. What do I know? What do I need to find out? How will I get the information I need? **Red Hat - Feelings** Intuition, hunches, gut instinct. My feelings right now. Feelings can change. No reasons are given. **Green Hat - Creativity** Ideas, alternatives, possibilities. Provocations - "PO". Solutions to black hat problems. BENEFITS Yellow Hat - Benefits Positives, plus points. Logical reasons are given. Why an idea is useful. CAUTIONS Black Hat - Cautions Difficulties, weaknesses, dangers. Logical reasons are given. Norming cont.

Identified Potential Areas

- Lack of dentists due to lack of staff (e.g., hygienist workforce shortage)
- Dentists cannot afford to do it (e.g., low reimbursement rates, extra cost to do extra paperwork)
- Dentists are not equipped to help people who need transportation or who are not able to get to the dentist altogether
- *Patients need help navigating the system to find a dentist*



Norming cont.

Given "Patients need help navigating the system to find a dentist", brainstorm ideas and deliverables

- Conduct surveys?
- Create videos?
- Do in-person trainings?
- Write op-eds?
- Develop materials to describe an accessible dental experience?



Performing

Build a collaboration larger than us

- Leadership (us): focus on patient information
 - Tri-fold and pamphlet containing info on the benefit and how to sign up
- ABLE NH: focus on dentists
 - Videos and relations to convince dentists to enroll
- NH Oral Health Coalition: connections
 - Help with relations with Delta Dental and DHHS



Results

The larger collaboration worked well

- NH Leadership (*ie: us*)
 - Trifold and flyer in final edits with DHHS
- ABLE NH
 - Videos currently being edited
- NH Oral Health Coalition
 - Will be distributing trifold and flyers when ready



New Hampshire Adult Dental Medicaid Benefit

Starting April 1, 2023, dentists enrolled with Medicaid will support the adult dental Medicaid benefit

What is Covered

The benefit includes the following services for eligible adults aged 21+

- X-rays and examinations
- Cleanings
- Fillings
- · Limited gum-related treatment
- Tooth extractions and other oral surgeries
- · Other appropriate general services such as anesthesia
- Transportation to and from dental appointments
- Support for oral health through care coordination

Individuals with removable partial and full dentures may qualify for services under the following criteria

- · Developmental Disability (DD) Waiver
- Acquired Brain Disorder(ABD) Waiver
- Choices for Independence (CFI) Waiver
- · Nursing Facility Residents

Finding a Dentist

Call your dentist to learn if they are already enrolled or plan on enrolling. You can also visit http://dentaquest.com/newhampshire to find a list of NH Smiles Adult Medicaid dental providers in your area. You can call any one of the providers to make an appointment.



Signing Up

- As of April 1, 2023, NH Medicaid benefits include dental.
- To find out if you qualify or to sign up for NH Medicaid, visit the DHHS NH EASY portal at https://nheasy.nh.gov/#/screening
- If you already receive Medicaid benefits, you should receive a new Medicaid card and dental welcome packet around <u>April 1</u>.
- Once you are signed up, contact a
 Medicaid-enrolled dentist. The dentist will
 help you with all the necessary paperwork.
 Let them know you're looking for the
 "Adult Medicaid Benefit".



Getting Help

New Hampshire's Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) selected NorthEast Delta Dental, in partnership with DentaQuest, to provide dental services for the adult dental benefit.

Conclusions/Takeaways

- A lot of the time was spent in the Forming and Storming stages due changes in group make up and focus.
- Communication and flexibility became <u>CRITICAL</u> for our group!!
