Key Elements of Behavior Lesson Plan/ Activity

- Objective
- Rationale
- Non-examples (what not to do)*
- Clear examples of expectations (what does desired behavior look like?)
- Some form of demonstration of behavior (teacher models nonexample and then example, students all practice together, student volunteers model wrong and right way)

*If asking students to demonstrate wrong and right way to behavior, two critical elements:

- 1. Start with the non-example (end on a positive note)
- 2. Set up a "stop" signal ahead of time (when I raise my hand like this, we will all stop and pay attention to the front of the room again)
